

4 Cubs Scouts needed for this opening

Materials: Posters with C, U, B, S on them with the lines the Cub Scouts say on the back. Remind the Cub Scouts NOT to say "Reduce, reuse and recycle" until all have said their parts.

The boys stand in front of the pack, hold up their cards and say their lines:

Cub Scout #1: C stands for "Cut Back." Reduce the amount of trash and waste you make.

Cub Scout #2: U stands for "Use." Use things again instead of throwing them away.


Cub Scout #3: B stands for "Be Sure." Be sure to recycle whatever you can instead of throwing it in the trash.

Cub Scout #4: S stands for "Save." Together we can save our planet from too much pollution.

All: Reduce, reuse, and recycle!




C stands for "Cut Back."

Use things again instead of throwing them away.


<u>After everyone says their part – all Cub Scouts say</u> together:

After everyone says their part – all Cub Scouts say together:

Reduce, Reuse, Recycle Activity

Materials:

None

Instructions:

1. Lead the Cub Scouts in the "Recycle Cheer." [Reduce, Reuse, Recycle Cheer - Divide the Cub Scouts into three sections. The first section yells, "Reduce!"; the second section yells, "Reuse!"; and the third section yells, "Recycle!" Alternate which section you point to and have fun yelling the words.



2. Cubmaster or Den leader:

[Below is a guided discussion on the 3Rs of recycling.]

We just did a cheer about the 3Rs of recycling. What are they? [Reduce, Reuse, Recycle]

Let's talk about each of these words.

What does **Reduce** mean? [Reduce means to use less.]

To use less of what? [All kinds of things. Paper, water, electricity, etc.]

At home – how can we use less water or less electricity? [Turn off the water while we brush our teeth, take shorter showers, etc. Turn off the lights when we leave a room.] How can we use less paper? [Use cloth towels to dry instead of paper towels. Use both sides of a piece of paper before being done with the paper.] Can we do similar things to reduce the amount of stuff we use at school? What could we do? [Various answers]

The second R is **Reuse**. What does reuse mean? [It means to use something again.]

What are some examples of things we reuse? [Water bottles, lunch boxes, food containers, etc] What are some things we could reuse? [Various answers.]

Our last R is **Recycle**. What do you think recycle means?

When we recycle something, we are collecting things that could be made into something else? Can you think of anything that we recycle [aluminum, glass, paper, etc) When we recycle, those things don't go into the garbage dump or landfill. Have you ever used a recycle bin? What have you recycled?

Challenge the Cub Scouts to think of one way they can reduce, one way they can reuse and one way they can recycle – either at home or at school.

Clothespin Bats

Materials:

Copies of bat wing template (1 per Cub Scout)

Black cardstock or construction paper (1/2 sheet per Cub Scout)

Clothespins (1 per Cub Scout)

Small wiggly eyes (2 per Cub Scout)

Glue

Markers/crayons


Scissors

Pencils

Instructions:

- 1. With scissors, cut out the bat template.
- 2. With a pencil, trace the bat template onto the black cardstock. Cut out the bat wings that you just traced onto the black cardstock.
- 3. With markers/crayons color the clothespin whatever color you would like this is the bat's body.
- 4. Glue the clothespin to the bat wings (cut out of the black cardstock).
- 5. Add eyes for the bat by gluing the small wiggly eyes onto the clothespin.





Litter Basketball

Materials:

Lots of crumpled newspaper, computer or copy paper Trash cans

Instructions:

- 1. Divide the den into two teams and seat them behind a throw line.
- 2. Place the trash cans about 10 feet away. (the distance depends on the motor skills of your boys.)
- 3. On the signal to GO, Cub Scouts fire their paper "basketballs" at the trash can goals. After a set amount of time stop the game. Count the number of "basketballs" in each trash can. The team with the most "basketballs" in the cans wins. Work together to collect the paper and place it in a recycle bin when you are finished playing.



Trash Your Trash

Materials:

Cubmaster:
